Definitions

Reconstructed vehicle. A vehicle that has been assembled or constructed largely by means of essential parts, new or used, derived from vehicles or makes of vehicles of various names, models and types or that, if originally otherwise constructed, has been materially altered by the removal of essential parts or by the addition or substitution of essential parts, new or used, derived from other vehicles or makes of vehicles. For the purposes of this paragraph, "essential parts" means integral and body parts, the removal, alteration or substitution of which will tend to conceal the identity or substantially alter the appearance of the vehicle.

Historic vehicle. Any of the following:

1. A vehicle bearing a model year date of original manufacture that is twenty-five years old or older.
2. A vehicle included in a list of historic vehicles filed with the director by a recognized historic or classic vehicle organization during the month of December of each year.
3. A reconstructed vehicle that the director determines, on application by the owner, retains at least the basic original body style as manufactured twenty-five years or more before the date of the application.

Classic car. A car included in the 1963 list of classic cars filed with the director by the classic car club of America. The director shall revise the list every five years.

Horseless carriage. A motor vehicle manufactured in 1915 or before.

Specially constructed vehicle. A vehicle not originally constructed under a distinctive name, make, model or type by a generally recognized manufacturer of vehicles.

Street Rod. A vehicle with a body design that retains at least the basic original style as manufactured in 1948 or earlier and that has been modified for safe road use. This modification may include:

1. Modification of the drive train and suspension and brake systems.
2. Modifications to the body through the use of materials such as steel or fiberglass.
3. Any other safety or comfort features.

Arizona Laws

From Arizona Administrative Code:

A.A.C. R17-4-203. Certificate of Title and Registration Application

A. In addition to the requirements of A.R.S. §§ 28-2051 and 28-2157, a person applying for an Arizona motor vehicle title certificate and registration shall complete a form supplied by the Motor Vehicle Division that contains the following information:

1. Vehicle information:

- a. Tab number;
- b. Initial registration month and year;
- c. Vehicle make, model, year, and body style;
- d. Mechanical or structural status indicating whether the vehicle is:
 - i. Dismantled,
 - ii. Reconstructed,
 - iii. Salvaged, or
 - iv. Specially constructed;
- e. Gross vehicle weight;
- f. Fuel type;
- g. Odometer information;
- h. Current title number and titling state.

2. An owner's or lessee's legal ownership status.

3. Lienholder information:

- a. Lienholder names and addresses, and
- b. Lien amount and date incurred.

4. If a mobile home, the physical site.

5. Co-ownership information:

- a. A statement of whether any survivorship rights in the vehicle exist; and
- b. A statement providing co-ownership legal status prescribed in R17-4-205(B).

6. Owner certification information verifying:

- a. Ownership,
- b. Inclusion of all liens and encumbrances, and
- c. Seller-verified odometer reading.

7. Applicant signatures.

8. An acknowledgement that:

- a. The applicant agrees or disagrees to the Division's release of the applicant's name on a commercial mailing list; and
- b. The applicant has read a printed explanation of odometer reading codes.

9. Other information required by the Division for internal processing and recordkeeping.

B. An applicant may voluntarily provide the following information on the form:

1. Applicant's birth date;
2. Applicant's driver license number; and
3. Applicant's federal employer identification number, if the applicant is taking title as a sole proprietor, partnership, corporation, or other legal business entity.

From Arizona Revised Statutes:

A.R.S. § 28-2051. Application for certificate of title; vision screening test

A. A person shall apply to the department on a form prescribed or authorized by the department for a certificate of title to a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer. The person shall make the application within fifteen days after the purchase or transfer of the vehicle, trailer or semitrailer except that a licensed motor vehicle dealer shall make the application within thirty days after the purchase or transfer. All transferees shall sign the application, except that one transferee may sign the application if both of the following apply:

1. The application is for the purposes of converting an out-of-state certificate of title to a certificate of title issued pursuant to this article.
2. The ownership or legal status of the motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer does not change.

B. The application shall contain:

1. The transferee's full name and either the driver license number of the transferee or a number assigned by the department.
2. The transferee's complete residence address.

3. A brief description of the vehicle to be issued a certificate of title.
4. The name of the manufacturer of the vehicle.
5. The serial number of the vehicle.
6. The last license plate number if applicable and if known and the state in which the license plate number was issued.
7. If the application is for a certificate of title to a new vehicle, the date of sale by the manufacturer or dealer to the person first operating the vehicle.
8. If the application is in the name of a lessor:
 - (a) The lessor shown on the application as the owner or transferee.
 - (b) At the option of the lessor, the lessee shown on the application as the registrant.
 - (c) The address of either the lessor or lessee.
 - (d) The signature of the lessor.
9. If the application is for a certificate of title to a specially constructed, reconstructed or foreign vehicle, a statement of that fact. For the purposes of this paragraph, "specially constructed vehicle" means a vehicle not originally constructed under a distinctive name, make, model or type by a generally recognized manufacturer of vehicles.
10. If an applicant rents or intends to rent the vehicle without a driver, a statement of that fact.
11. Other information required by the department.

C. Unless subsection B, paragraph 8 of this section applies, on request of an applicant, the department shall allow the applicant to provide on the certificate of title of a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer a post office box address that is regularly used by the applicant.

D. A person shall submit the following information with an application for a certificate of title:

1. To a vehicle previously registered:
 - (a) The odometer mileage disclosure statement prescribed by § 28-2058.
 - (b) If the applicant is applying for a certificate of title pursuant to § 28-2060, the applicant's statement of the odometer reading as of the date of application.
2. To a new vehicle:
 - (a) Either of the following:

(i) A manufacturer's certificate of origin showing the date of sale to the dealer or person first receiving the vehicle from the manufacturer. Before the department issues a certificate of title to a new vehicle, a manufacturer's certificate of origin shall be surrendered to the department.

(ii) A factory invoice, a form that is provided by the department or other documentation that shows the date of sale to the dealer or the person who first received the vehicle from the manufacturer.

(b) The name of the dealer or person.

(c) A description sufficient to identify the vehicle.

(d) A statement certifying that the vehicle was new when sold.

(e) If sold through a dealer, a statement by the dealer certifying that the vehicle was new when sold to the applicant.

E. The department may request that an applicant who appears in person for a certificate of title of a motor vehicle, trailer or semitrailer satisfactorily complete the vision screening test prescribed by the department.

A.R.S. § 28-2411. Personalized street rod vehicle special plates

A. The department shall issue personalized street rod vehicle special plates to a person who owns a vehicle with a body design that retains at least the basic original style as manufactured in 1948 or earlier and that has been modified for safe road use. This modification may include:

1. Modification of the drive train and suspension and brake systems.
2. Modifications to the body through the use of materials such as steel or fiberglass.
3. Any other safety or comfort features.

B. A person who complies with subsection A may apply for personalized street rod vehicle special plates by indicating on the application the letters, numbers or combination of letters and numbers requested as a registration number. The department shall determine the number of positions allowed on the personalized street rod vehicle special plates. The personalized street rod vehicle special plates shall not conflict with existing plates and shall not duplicate registration numbers. The department may refuse to issue or may suspend, cancel or revoke any combination of letters or numbers or any combination of letters and numbers that carries connotations that are offensive to good taste and decency, any combination that is misleading or any combination that duplicates other plates.

C. If a person who has been issued personalized street rod vehicle special plates sells, trades or otherwise releases ownership of the vehicle on which the plates have been displayed and

relinquishes the plates to the new owner of the vehicle, the person shall release the person's priority to the letters, numbers or combination of letters and numbers that is displayed on the personalized street rod vehicle special plates in the manner prescribed by the director. The person to whom the plates are relinquished shall apply to the department for issuance of the plates to the new applicant.

A.R.S. § 28-2481. Historic value license plate fees

In addition to the payment of all other fees required by law, the following fees are required for license plates issued pursuant to this article:

1. For each original license plate, twenty-five dollars.
2. For each annual renewal of the license plate, ten dollars.

A.R.S. § 28-2482. License plates for horseless carriages; definition

A. The department shall issue license plates for a horseless carriage on application and in the manner and at the time prescribed by the department. The license plates are in lieu of the regular license plates issued by the department.

B. The registration numbers and license plates assigned to horseless carriages shall be manufactured from Arizona copper and shall run in separate numerical series beginning with "horseless carriage no. 1". The license plates shall be of a distinguishing color.

C. On renewal of the registration of a horseless carriage, the department shall annually issue symbols or devices as provided in § 28-2355.

D. For the purposes of this section, "horseless carriage" means a motor vehicle manufactured in 1915 or before.

A.R.S. § 28-2483. License plates for classic cars; definition

A. The department shall issue special license plates for a classic car on application and in the manner and at the time prescribed by the department. The license plates are in lieu of the regular license plates issued by the department.

B. The registration numbers and license plates assigned to classic cars shall be manufactured from Arizona copper and shall run in separate numerical series commencing with "classic car no. 1". The license plates shall be of a distinguishing color but different from the color selected for license plates issued under § 28-2482 or 28-2484. The director may allow a request for classic car special plates to be combined with a request for personalized special plates. If the director allows such a combination, the request shall be in a form prescribed by the director and is subject to the fees for the personalized special plates in addition to the fees required for the classic car special plates.

C. On renewal of registration of a classic car, the department shall annually issue symbols or devices as provided in § 28-2355.

D. For the purposes of this section, "classic car" means a car included in the 1963 list of classic cars filed with the director by the classic car club of America. The director shall revise the list every five years.

A.R.S. § 28-2484. License plates for historic vehicles; definition

A. The department shall issue special license plates for a historic vehicle on application and in the manner and at the time prescribed by the department. The license plates are in lieu of the regular license plates issued by the department.

B. The registration numbers and special license plates assigned to the historic vehicles shall be manufactured from Arizona copper and shall run in separate unique numerical series. The license plates shall be of a distinguishing color but different from the color selected for license plates issued under § 28-2482 or 28-2483.

C. On renewal of registration of a historic vehicle, the department shall annually issue symbols or devices as provided in § 28-2355.

D. The director shall grant the final approval of a vehicle to be licensed under this section.

E. For the purposes of this section, "historic vehicle" means any of the following:

1. A vehicle bearing a model year date of original manufacture that is twenty-five years old or older.
2. A vehicle included in a list of historic vehicles filed with the director by a recognized historic or classic vehicle organization during the month of December of each year.
3. A reconstructed vehicle that the director determines, on application by the owner, retains at least the basic original body style as manufactured twenty-five years or more before the date of the application.

A.R.S. § 28-2486. Retention of old certificate of title

A. The owner of a vehicle may retain the old canceled certificate of title if:

1. The application for a new title is granted.
2. The old title is marked "canceled" on its face.
3. A photostatic copy paid for by the applicant is made of the canceled certificate of title.

B. The photostatic copy is deemed to be the original for purposes of canceled title records of the department.

A.R.S. § 28-2487. Model year date license plates

An owner of a vehicle that is eligible for registration pursuant to § 28-2483 or 28-2484 may use a license plate previously issued by this state with the date of the year corresponding to the model year date when the vehicle was manufactured in lieu of the license plates issued pursuant to § 28-2483 or 28-2484. To qualify for the license plate authorized by this section:

1. The department shall approve the license plate and determine that the model year date license plate is legible and serviceable and that the license plate numbers do not conflict with other numbers currently assigned to license plates issued by the department. The department may consult with an organization of old car hobbyists in determining whether the date of the year of the license plate to be used corresponds to the model year date when the vehicle was manufactured.
2. The owner of the vehicle shall comply with the requirements for the registration of the vehicle.

A.R.S. § 28-2488. Relinquishment of special plates

If a person who has been issued special plates pursuant to this article sells, trades or otherwise releases ownership of the vehicle to which the special plates have been assigned, the person may relinquish the plates to the new owner of the vehicle. On relinquishing the special plates, the person releases priority to the letters, numbers or combination of letters and numbers that is displayed on the special plates in the manner prescribed by the director. The person to whom the special plates are relinquished shall apply to the department for issuance of the special plates to that person.

Arizona Equipment Exemptions

From Arizona Revised Statutes:

A.R.S. § 28-2485. Safety requirements; compliance

Notwithstanding any other law, a motor vehicle that is eligible to be licensed under this article is in compliance with the safety requirements of the laws of this state relating to motor vehicles if the original safety equipment placed on the motor vehicle by the manufacturer of the motor vehicle is in good operating condition or if the original equipment has been replaced by equipment equal to or more efficient than the original equipment.

A.R.S. § 28-943. Single beam road lighting equipment

Head lamps that are arranged to provide a single distribution of light are permitted on motor vehicles manufactured and sold before January 1, 1951, and on neighborhood electric vehicles, in lieu of multiple beam road lighting equipment specified in this article, if the single distribution of light complies with the following requirements and limitations:

1. The head lamps are aimed so that when the vehicle is not loaded none of the high intensity portion of the light projects, at a distance of twenty-five feet ahead, higher than a level of five inches below the level of the center of the lamp that is aimed and in no case higher than forty-two inches above the level on which the vehicle stands at a distance of seventy-five feet ahead.
2. The intensity is sufficient to reveal persons and vehicles at a distance of at least two hundred feet.

A.R.S. § 28-947. Special restrictions on lamps

A. A person shall direct a lighted lamp or illuminating device on a motor vehicle, other than a head lamp, spot lamp, auxiliary lamp or flashing front direction signal, that projects a beam of light of an intensity greater than three hundred candlepower so that no part of the beam strikes the level of the roadway on which the vehicle stands at a distance of more than seventy-five feet from the vehicle.

B. A person shall not drive or move a vehicle or equipment on a highway with a lamp or device on the vehicle that is capable of displaying a red or red and blue light or lens visible from directly in front of the center of the vehicle. Lights visible from the front of a vehicle shall be amber or white. This section does not apply to either of the following:

1. An authorized emergency vehicle or a vehicle on which a red or red and blue light or lens visible from the front is expressly authorized or required by this chapter.
2. An emergency vehicle that is solely used for hobby or display purposes and that has been issued a historic vehicle license plate pursuant to § 28-2484 if either of the following applies:

(a) The lights are covered and are not activated while a person is transporting or driving the vehicle to or from a parade, authorized assemblage of historic vehicles or test.

(b) The lights are activated only in a parade, for an authorized assemblage of historic vehicles or for testing purposes.

C. Except as provided in subsection D or E of this section, flashing lights on motor vehicles are prohibited except either:

...

A.R.S. § 28-954. Horns and warning devices

...

C. A vehicle shall not be equipped with and a person shall not use on a vehicle a siren, whistle or bell, except as otherwise permitted in this section.

...

F. A siren shall be allowed on a fire engine that is solely used for hobby or display purposes and that has been issued a historic vehicle license plate pursuant to § 28-2484 if either of the following applies:

1. The siren is covered and is not activated while a person is transporting or driving the vehicle to or from a parade, authorized assemblage of historic vehicles or test.

2. The siren is activated only in a parade, for an authorized assemblage of historic vehicles or for testing purposes.

A.R.S. § 28-957.01. Windshields required

A. The following vehicles shall be equipped with an adequate windshield:

1. A passenger vehicle, except a motorcycle, an all-terrain vehicle and a golf cart **manufactured or modified before June 17, 1998.**

2. A motor truck or truck tractor, except fire trucks, fire engines or other fire apparatus, whether publicly or privately owned.

B. This section does not apply to an implement of husbandry or to an **antique, classic or horseless carriage automobile if it was not originally equipped with a windshield.**

A.R.S. § 28-958.01. Rear fender splash guards

A. A person shall not operate a truck, trailer, semitrailer or bus on a highway unless the vehicle is equipped with rear fender splash guards that comply with the specifications provided in this section.

B. The splash guards:

1. Shall be attached in a manner that prevents the splashing of mud or water on the windshield of other motor vehicles.
2. Shall extend to a length of not more than eight inches from the ground.
3. Shall be wide enough to cover the full tread or treads of the tires being protected.
4. Shall be installed close enough to the tread surface of the tire or wheel to control the side throw of the bulk of the thrown road surface material.
5. May be constructed of a flexible rubberized material.
6. Shall be attached in a manner that, regardless of movement either in the splash guards or the vehicle, the splash guards retain their general parallel relationship to the tread surface of the tire or wheel under all ordinary operating conditions.

C. This section does not apply to:

1. A vehicle commonly known as a pickup truck with a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating of ten thousand pounds or less, except that this section applies **if the pickup truck has been modified from the original bumper height design to raise the center of gravity of the pickup truck.**

All Plates - The annual renewal special plate fee will be due when your vehicle registration is next renewed. If your registration expires within the next three months, you may wish to renew the registration early, before submitting this application, to avoid the first annual renewal special plate fee.

Plates may only be issued for a vehicle that is currently registered or leased in your name. If leased but not registered in your name, submit a document showing you as lessee. Some plates may not be issued to commercial vehicles with a declared gross vehicle weight of 26,001 lbs or more. A lost or mutilated plate may be replaced for \$5.00 (plus postage/handling, if mailed). Please be aware that it is a Class 2 misdemeanor to alter or modify any Arizona license plate, per A.R.S. §28-2531(B)(1).

Disability Symbol (International Symbol of Access) - For parking in specially marked spaces. Must complete form # 96-0104 (available online), signed by a physician, hospital administrator or registered nurse practitioner; or have one on file. Available to individuals and organizations.

Personalized Plates - Allow six weeks for processing. Your new plate will be mailed to you. All personalized choices must be approved. We may refuse to issue or may suspend any plate that suggests a meaning that is offensive, misleading or that duplicates any existing plate or plate series. The fee for a remake of a plate already ordered or issued is \$5.00 plus postage/handling; if the vehicle registration has expired, full renewal fees are required.

If after one year from the vehicle registration refund or expiration, you have not transferred the plate to another vehicle you own, the plate format will be canceled and become available for reissue to another person.

All personalized plates (except for trailers) may have the disability symbol as the first character, at no added charge. If you are eligible, check the in first column below, instead of filling in a letter/number in that box (see example), and attach form # 96-0104. The number of characters available for a letter/number for that plate will be reduced by one to allow for the symbol.

- Use only capital letters and numbers. No punctuation or other symbols. Use I for i, L for l, 1 for one, and V (underlined) for v.
Choices with the maximum number of characters may not have spaces. Choices will automatically be centered on the plate.
Choices with less than the maximum characters may have half spaces (indicate with single slash "/") or full spaces.

Plates Available as Personalized or Standard

Regular Personalized Full size plate (7 characters maximum), Small size plate ¹ (5).

Alternative Fuel (7) Standard \$8/0, Personalized \$33/25 Must be powered by liquefied petroleum gas (LPG, propane), natural gas (CNG/LNG), a blend of 70% alternative fuel and 30% petroleum-based fuel, hydrogen, solar or electric (excluding golf carts).

Amateur Radio (6) Available personalized only (with call sign) \$25/25 Proof of current amateur radio license from Federal Communications Commission. \$17 of the fee goes to a special fund for college scholarships, youth programs, and emergency response communications.

Arizona Agriculture (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to the Arizona FFA which provides premier leadership, personal growth and career success opportunities for students enrolled in Agricultural Education programs in Arizona.

Arizona Cardinals (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to support programs designed to improve the lives of children, women and minorities in AZ.

Arizona Centennial (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to the Arizona geological survey to pay costs related to the maintenance and operation of mining, mineral and natural resources educational museum.

Arizona Coyotes (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to the Arizona Coyotes Foundation, which supports non-profit organizations that serve children and service men and women with healthcare, education, cultural arts and youth sports in the State of Arizona.

Arizona Diamondbacks (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee for youth education/development, and housing and healthcare for low-income persons.

Arizona Highways (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to the Arizona Highways magazine.

Arizona Historical Society (5) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to museums and programs state-wide.

Arizona Science Center (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to delivering science education to students, teachers and families.

Arizona Sportsmen for Wildlife Conservation (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to fund wildlife habitat projects, outdoor recreational and educational opportunities.

Arizona State University (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee for academic scholarships.

Barrett-Jackson (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to Barrett-Jackson Charities, to benefit the 2018 "Driven Hearts" initiative for the American Heart Association.

Boy Scouts of Arizona (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to the Grand Canyon Council of Boy Scouts of America.

Channel 8 PBS (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. Arizona Foundation of Public Broadcast Television, which provides noncommercial and nonsectarian educational television services.

Character Education (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee for character education programs.

Child Abuse Prevention (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee for child abuse prevention.

Childhood Cancer Research (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee for childhood cancer and rare childhood disease research.

Classic Car (3) Vehicle must be on the list of classic cars filed with the Motor Vehicle Division by the [Classic Car Club of America](#). This list is updated every five years. May require a vehicle inspection.

Environmental (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee for environmental education.

Extraordinary Educators (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee for Arizona public educators who propose extraordinary activities, projects or lessons for students in K-8.

Families of Fallen Police Officers (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to help in the healing of family survivors of police officers who died in the line of duty in Arizona.

Fire Fighter (6) Applicant must submit an original certification form provided by the [Professional Fire Fighters of Arizona](#). \$17 of the fee goes to the organization.

Firefighter Safety Training (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee is used to provide scholarships for life safety training of firefighters in Arizona.

First Responder Available full size or small size plate ¹. Personalized full size (7), small (5). No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to programs that provide assistance to Public Safety state-wide.

Girls Scouts (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to the Girl Scouts for enriching experiences, such as extraordinary field trips, sports skill-building clinics, community service projects, cultural exchanges and environmental stewardships.

Gold Star Family (5) Must be spouse or (by adoption or blood) a child, parent, brother or sister of a person who lost his/her life while on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces. \$17 of the fee for construction and maintenance of the Enduring Freedom Memorial.

Golden Rule (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee for programs that demonstrate the promotion of the golden rule in schools and communities in AZ.

Hunger Relief (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to Hunger Relief Special Plate Fund, which will be used to fund organizations that provide food distribution to hungry people in Arizona.

In God We Trust (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to promote the national motto "In God We Trust".

Keep Arizona Beautiful (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee for the litter prevention and litter cleanup special plate fund.

Luke Air Force Base Available full size or small size plate ¹. Personalized full size (5), small (4). No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to support the Men, Women, Families and Mission of Luke AFB for programs and services geared towards Morale & Well-Being, Culture & Tradition and Mission Sustainability.

Masonic Fraternity (7) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to charities supported by the Arizona Masons.

Midwestern University (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to support Health Sciences Academic Scholarships.

Military Support/Freedom Available full size or small size plate ¹. Personalized full size (7), small (5). No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to benefit veterans in Arizona.

Navajo Nation (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee goes to the tribe for traffic control devices.

Northern Arizona University (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 of the fee for academic scholarships.

Pet Friendly/Spay & Neuter (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 for animal spaying/neutering.

- Phoenix International Raceway** (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 to Motorsports Charities to provide resources and charitable support for children through education, medical treatment, dream experiences and volunteerism.
- Phoenix Suns** (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 for youth education and development, college scholarships and community development.
- Pink Ribbon/Cancer Awareness** (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 for breast and cervical cancer screening and diagnostic awareness and outreach services in Arizona.
- Purple Heart** Available full size or small size plate ¹. Standard \$25/5, Personalized full size (6), small (4) \$50/30. Must be a veteran and a Purple Heart recipient and provide a copy of a DD214 or 215, WDAGO forms 53-55 or 53-98, NAVPERS 553 or NAVMC 78 that indicates Purple Heart recipient, or provide an original letter from the Arizona Dept. of Veterans' Svcs verifying eligibility. Initial application fee goes to benefit Veterans in Arizona. ^{2,3}
- Route 66** Available full size or small size plate ¹. Personalized full size (6), small (4). No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 to the preservation of the historical federal highway.
- San Carlos Apache Tribe** (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 to the tribe for traffic control devices.
- Southwest PGA** Available to everyone. \$17 goes to support golf scholarships for youth based on community involvement and academic excellence. Initial Application Fee \$25 / Annual Renewal Fee \$25.
- Special Olympics Arizona** (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 goes to support inclusion of individuals with/without disabilities through sports, health, youth and adult leadership and other self-advocacy programs.
- Street Rod** (7) Available personalized only \$25/25. Must retain the basic original body style as manufactured in 1948 or before.
- Thunderbird School of Global Management** (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 for the school's operations and activities.
- Transplantation Awareness – Organ Donor** (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 for organ transplantation awareness programs.
- University of Arizona** (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 for academic scholarships.
- U.S. Marine Corps** - Available full size or small size plate ¹. Personalized full size (6), small (4). No requirements. Available to everyone \$17 of the fee is used to award scholarships to children of Marines and Navy Corpsmen who were killed or wounded in combat or who have demonstrated financial need.
- Veteran** Available full size or small size plate ¹. Standard \$25/25; Personalized full (6), small (4) \$50/25. Copy of DD214, 215, 2 (retired), 2 (reserve), 1173 or 256A, an original statement of honorable service from U.S. Dept. of Veterans Affairs or Arizona Dept. of Veterans' Svcs, or any of these cards: American Legion, Arizona credential with Veteran distinguishing mark, Department of Veterans Affairs veteran identification, Disabled American Veterans, Military Officers Association of America, Military Order of the Purple Heart, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Vietnam Veterans of America or U.S. military ID (active or inactive duty) ³. \$17 of the initial and annual renewal fee goes to a special fund to benefit Veterans in Arizona.
- White Mountain Apache Tribe** (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 to the tribe for traffic control devices.
- Women Veterans** (6) No requirements. Available to everyone. \$17 to Arizona Veterans' Donation Fund.

Plates Available as Standard Only (No Personalized Plate Available)

- Congressional Medal of Honor** No fee. Must be recipient of Congressional Medal of Honor and provide an original letter verifying eligibility from the Arizona Dept. of Veterans' Svcs. ²
- Former Prisoner of War** \$15/5 Must have received an honorable discharge and provide a copy of a current membership card from the American Ex-Prisoners of War association, or an original letter from the Arizona Dept. of Veterans' Svcs verifying eligibility. The initial application fee goes to benefit Veterans in Arizona. ^{2,3}
- Historic Vehicle** \$25/10 (add postage/handling \$6.33 full size or \$4.80 small size plate) Vehicle must bear a model date of original manufacture that is at least 25 years old. May require a vehicle inspection.
- Pearl Harbor Survivor** \$25/5 Must have been active duty on station during the attack, received an honorable discharge and provide form AVSC 02-25, Part II from the Arizona Dept. of Veterans' Svcs. The initial application fee goes to benefit Veterans in Arizona. ^{2,3}

¹ Small size plate is limited to motorcycles and golf carts, except that trailers with a Regular plate can have either small or full size.

² May transfer plate to another vehicle. No transfer fee.

³ May also be issued to the spouse, parent, child, brother or sister of an eligible person who has been issued this plate.
