- AN ACT Relating to street rods; and amending RCW 46.04.571 and
- 2 46.37.500.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.04.571 and 1996 c 225 s 4 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 "Street rod vehicle" is a motor vehicle, other than a motorcycle,
- 7 that meets the following conditions:
- 8 (1)(a) The vehicle was manufactured before 1949, ((or)) (b) the
- 9 vehicle has been assembled or reconstructed using major component parts
- 10 of a motor vehicle manufactured before 1949, or (c) the vehicle was
- 11 assembled or manufactured after 1949, to resemble a vehicle
- 12 manufactured before 1949; and
- 13 (2)(a) The vehicle has been modified in its body style or design
- 14 through the use of nonoriginal or reproduction components, such as
- 15 frame, engine, drive train, suspension, or brakes in a manner that does
- 16 not adversely affect its safe performance as a motor vehicle or render
- 17 it unlawful for highway use, or (b) the body has been constructed from
- 18 nonoriginal materials or has been altered dimensionally or in shape and
- 19 appearance from the original manufactured body.

- 1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.37.500 and 1988 c 15 s 2 are each amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 (1) Except as authorized under subsection (2) of this section, no 4 person may operate any motor vehicle, trailer, or semitrailer that is 5 not equipped with fenders, covers, flaps, or splash aprons adequate for 6 minimizing the spray or splash of water or mud from the roadway to the 7 rear of the vehicle. All such devices shall be as wide as the tires 8 behind which they are mounted and extend downward at least to the 9 center of the axle.
- (2) A motor vehicle that is not less than forty years old ((and))
 or a street rod vehicle that is owned and operated primarily as a
 collector's item need not be equipped with fenders when the vehicle is
 used and driven during fair weather on well-maintained, hard-surfaced
 roads.
